SERVICE OF BEGINNING

Today we mark a transition in Bryce's service to our congregation. Though he has been serving here at St. James for more than two years as a Synodically Authorized Minister, as part of his training toward rostered ministry in the ELCA at Wartburg Theological Seminary, we celebrate the beginning of his Seminary Internship. During this time, he will be formally evaluated and supported by our congregational Site Committee. The ELCA uses the title "Vicar" to denote this role in the congregation. Starting today, he will be both a Synodically Authorized Minister (SAM) through the Southeastern Iowa Synod and a Vicar by virtue of his status as a seminary intern.

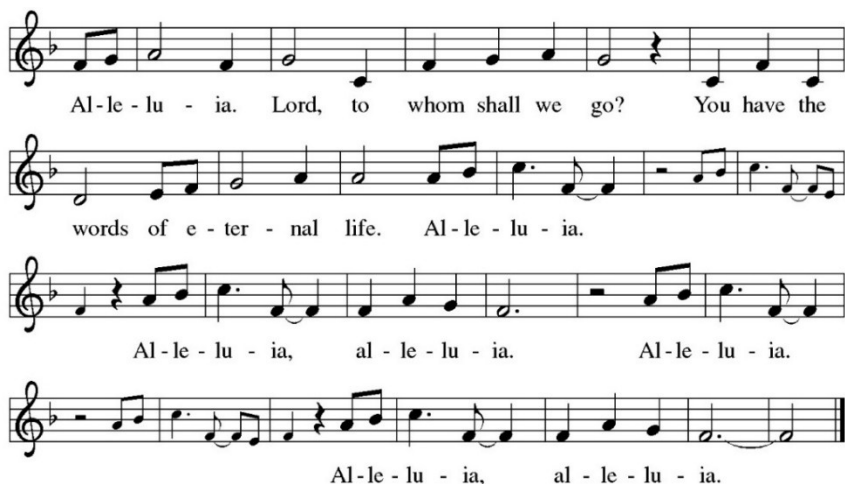
SECOND READING: 2 Thessalonians 3:6-13

Elizabeth of Hungary, renewer of society, died 1231

Monday, November 17, 2025

Born in Hungary, Elizabeth was betrothed to the son of the Landgrave of Thuringia, and at age four was taken to be raised with him at the Wartburg Castle. Ten years later they were married. She was very generous to the poor, and after her husband's death she lived in cruel hardship until her own death at age twenty-four.
