# ANNOUNCEMENT Evening Prayer and Congregational Business Meeting

**Date:** June 5, 2024 **Time:** 7:00 p.m.

**Detail:** St. James Congregational Council invites you to join Bishop Amy Current, SEIA Synod, for Evening Prayer and Congregational Business Meeting. At the March 2024 meeting of the Congregational Council a motion was passed to bring a decision affecting the next season of pastoral leadership to the congregation for a vote. Information pertinent to that vote is included below.

April 23, 2024

Beloved people of St. James:

Many of you have asked about the process to become ordained with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) since I began in my role in September 2023. As you know, I serve you as a Synodically Authorized Minister (SAM) under the authorization of Bishop Amy Current, SEIA Synod. SAMs are non-ordained persons who provide ministry of Word and Sacrament to congregations when ordained clergy are unavailable. Presently, the ELCA is facing a significant clergy shortage. Training and authorizing SAMs to serve in local congregations is one step, among many, taken by the ELCA to address that shortage.

My desire is to become ordained with the ELCA as quickly as possible. I have found a spiritual and theological home with the ELCA and with you all here at St. James. The following information outlines the steps I have taken toward ordination over the last 10 months and the path laid out for me over the next four years.

In order to become ordained, three entities must cooperate and affirm me in the ordination process: Bishop's office of the SEIA Synod, ELCA seminary, and our local congregation.

- 1. **Seminary:** I applied and was accepted to Wartburg Theological Seminary in Dubuque, IA. I plan to start the Collaborative Learning Program toward a Master of Divinity degree in September 2024. The program takes four years to complete.
- 2. **Synod:** Deacon Jodi Schuman, Assistant to the Bishop for Candidacy, and I are finalizing the last piece of my candidacy application in advance of the Synod's June 7th candidacy committee meeting. With their blessing, I plan to be officially entranced to candidacy sometime following that meeting.
- 3. **Local Congregation:** I hope to remain a SAM at St. James until I complete seminary and am ordained. At that time I may be considered by you all for an official pastoral call according to our church constitution.

If all of these paths work out according to schedule - and it seems they will - I will be set to begin at Wartburg in the fall of 2024 for four years of seminary training. At the end of that process I will be eligible for ordination as a pastor in the ELCA.

#### Implications of my progress for the congregation

In order for me to work toward ordination as I outline above and remain at St. James, our congregation needs to agree to be my educational placement for the duration of my four-year seminary training.

That means I would continue to serve St. James as a SAM while I attend seminary. This route to a Master of Divinity degree is called the Collaborative Learning Program. More information regarding this program is available on the Wartburg website.

If St. James takes on this agreement with me and the seminary, it would communicate their commitment to retain me as a SAM for the next four years to supply our church with the ministry of Word and Sacrament. This arrangement seems to work well for our congregation since there is a significant shortage of ELCA pastors available and the last 8 months of my service to you all have proved fruitful.

#### Congregational vote detail

St. James needs to decide if you want to become the Collaborative Learning Site for me for the duration of my seminary training. To help communicate with the congregation the various converging aspects of ordination and the role of SAMs in our Synod more generally, Bishop Amy Current offered to attend our congregational meeting and answer questions regarding this process.

The following motion will be presented to the congregation at the recommendation of Church Council on June 5, 2024:

A motion for St. James Lutheran Church to enter into an educational agreement with Wartburg Theological Seminary of Dubuque, lowa to become the Collaborative Learning Site for Bryce Hewlett while he attends seminary.

These rules from our Church Constitution regarding a congregational vote will be observed.

- The method to count votes for/against the motion will be by raising hands.
- Forty voting members shall constitute a quorum (C10.04)
- The motion will pass/fail by a simple majority of voting members (C10.06).
- Members may attend the meeting and vote through Zoom teleconference (C10.08)

By passing this motion St. James Lutheran Church understands the following commitments.

- An annual administrative fee paid by the congregation to Wartburg based on a percentage of the cost of tuition is requested by the seminary. If that fee is prohibitive, other arrangements may be made. The fee is approximately \$1,500/year.
- St. James will form or designate a committee to support and provide scheduled feedback to aid the student's education during this engagement.
- At a certain point in the course sequence, the requirements for Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) will also need to be accommodated by the congregation. There may be an arrangement available to complete this requirement within the congregation or in a local setting outside of the congregation.






#### Sarah Circle

Luther Properties, Inc. works in partnership with HUD to provide subsidized, independent apartments to eligible persons. Rent is based on income, with utilities included, and handicap units are also available.




